

The goal of SAFE is to increase seatbelt use and decrease distracted driving among students while providing strong traffic safety messages throughout the school year.







WHAT CAN I DO TO HELP? ACTIVE BYSTANDER APPROACH METHODS

DIRECT

You can handle a situation directly by your words or actions. Tell the person causing harm to stop their behavior or use appropriate body language to signal disapproval.

INDIRECT

You can handle a situation indirectly by getting someone who knows the parties involved. Work with someone else who can do a part to defuse the situation.

WITH AN ALLY/ FRIENDS

Grabbing a friend or ally to help with the situation can ensure you are safe, as there is strength in numbers.

This also helps reiterate nontolerance to the person causing harm's behavior.

DISTRACTION

Find a way to redirect the attention to something else. Tell a joke to defuse the situation or do something that draws attention to one party involved in that situation.

AFTER THE FACT/NEXT DAY

Check in with the person who has received harm to ask what happened and if they need help with anything now. Hold the person who caused the harm accountable.

PROTOCOL

Bring people in who are qualified to handle violent situations.
Follow a written law or policy that applies to the situation at hand.

JUST A REMINDER

You can only help someone if you are also staying safe. Never step into a situation that would cause you harm.


